Father Behr writes: Dear Parishioners,

FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION

We can review our relation to God in respect of the phenomenon of the passage of time today on this Feast of the Presentation. God stands outside of time. He created time. He is waiting, as it were, for us to join Him in the eternal realm. The original meaning of eternity is 'outside time' – Latin root 'aeternitas', meaning endless duration or timelessness.

At the Feast of the Presentation the baby Jesus is presented to God by Joseph and Mary. Time seems to stand still. The holy man Simeon realises that the Messiah is Jesus, that history is about to change in a massive way. Christ Jesus, true God and true Man, is the eternal man, the being who brings an end to death once and for all.

Simeon also foresees the suffering that Our Lord would face three decades later. With it he realises and speaks of a 'sword that would pierce' Mary's heart. Our Lady at this early moment of Jesus' life starts to grasp that Jesus must die young and give all to glorify the Father, maker of Heaven and Earth, who dwells in the eternal and everlasting realm where death has no dominion.

The eternal realm of heaven is our goal and our aim, won for us at much cost. Let us be grateful to God. Let us present to Him on this day our thanks for Jesus. We are invited to give Jesus a chance to open our hearts, to ask Him to help us be more forgiving and more focused on the riches of God's graces. These graces, found especially in the sacraments, and particularly in the worthy reception of Holy Communion, assist and lift us. They revive our drooping spirits and help us to help our neighbours and those with deep troubles: the hungry, the depressed, those with ruinous addictions, the lonely, to name but a few.

These graces are full of divine energy and supernatural light. They illuminate our path away from the wrongdoing that can at worst lead to hell, or a lengthy purgatory, to good works prompted by love and therefore to a quicker entry to heaven. There, Holy Mighty Immortal God dwells radiating indescribable joy, love and beauty. Our Saviour Jesus is inviting us there, to the eternal mansions He has prepared for us.
