DREAMING SPIRES CANAL RETREAT 2025

To go on a narrowboat retreat is like stepping into a different world. The speed of the craft is just three miles an hour, which gives all the advantages of travelling slowly in the fresh air without walking, although there will be plenty of opportunities to leave the boat and stroll in quiet solitude or with others. Walkers will hardly be left behind!

Then there is the landscape. Open country welcomes, with waterfowl and wildlife, geology, and a delightful sense of being away from it all, which is the most precious gift of time spent on a narrowboat. Our narrowboat retreat will take us from Aldermaston to Oxford. We shall spend some time in Oxford before heading back.

If you'd like to be part of what we've called the Dreaming Spires Retreat, then get in touch as soon as possible. We have fewer than a handful of places available. The retreat begins on the 16th June and ends on the 23rd June. The cost will be £250 per person, plus food costs (which will include several pub lunches or evening meals).
